Dear Friends of Trinity,

Below is an excerpt of a letter we received last month. I hope you will realize that small acts of kindness and mercy are what the Christmas season is all about.

I am writing to you as a tribute to my father in honor of Veteran's Day, 2011 and to tell you a short story about my dad in the Korean War. My father's name is John S. Techman, he and my mother are members of St. Jude's Church in New Lenox and my father is a life-long resident of New Lenox. He is 84 this year and, thanks be to God, my parents are both in good health.

I am blessed to be able to visit them often and I drive past your church every week on my way into town. Now is the time for me to thank you and "pay it forward."

My story begins in 1952 with my father in Korea, having been drafted into the 7th infantry of the Army. He arrived there in December of 1951 and was sent to the Mung Dun valley area where the Korean war was in full swing. His division pulled out and were sent to the "punch bowl" where Corporal Techman served as a forward observer for 4.2 mortars.

My father described the area as a circle of mountains in a huge valley, one mile across filled with military supplies. In January or February of '52, his troop was on a mountaintop, 4 to 5,000 feet elevation in the middle of winter in a bunker. They were very cold and ate c-rations and received one "hot" meal a day brought up from rear areas of the valley. By the time their food arrived, it was no longer hot and the beverage was instant coffee that they had to heat with their own water with their mess kit. The coffee would freeze and many of the soldiers wrote to their families at home to send candles so they could heat their coffee.

I am not sure what Mayberry, aka New Lenox was like in 1952, but the family story is that there were no candles available at St. Jude's to send to my father. Having grown up myself in New Lenox in the later 50's and 60's, I know that it was a small town where we didn't lock our doors and neighbors helped each other. My Grandmother and Grandfather, Stanley and Caroline, had lived on Pine Street in New Lenox since the 20's when they were married. Somehow, they were able to gather up used candles from the Lutheran church, perhaps one of their neighbors belonged to the Lutheran church.

I am happy to report that my father survived the war, went on to become a small-town home builder in New Lenox, and raise 4 children and he and my mother are now blessed with 10 grandchildren and 2 great-grand-children.

And the kindness extended to him during this difficult time of war, away from home, has never been forgotten by either him or our family. So with thanksgiving to God for this small favor, I am sending a token of my gratitude in the form of a small check as a tribute to my father and in thanks to the kind people who attended your church in 1952.

May you find some creative way to "pay it forward."
