<u>Financial Secretary's and Treasurer's 1st Quarter Report:</u> The congregation adopted a 2016 General Fund Budget of \$207,457 at its Annual Meeting on January 31st. The Budget is 2.8% higher than the 2015 budget. The Council deemed the adjustment warranted to cover expected operating costs. Modest salary increases of 2% were granted for Pastor, the Church Secretary and Choir Director. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

During the quarter, all due bills were paid. Budgeted contributions were made to Missions and LCCF. General Fund receipts were 12.26% higher than those received during the same period last year. Operating Expenses were in line with the first quarter of 2015. We want to thank everyone for their support of Trinity Lutheran Church and its missions. Update from Council President, Jeff McDonald

While April showers are more commonly known for bringing May flowers, this past month they brought with them the end of some projects that were regrettably delayed last year. Notably, we saw the completion of our front stairs and sidewalk as well as the installation of the lift railing. Special thanks to our own Scott Beaudry from Sterling Concrete for the great work on our stairs. We can now proceed with getting the railings installed for the main stairs and with getting the main section wrapped in limestone to match the rest of our exterior. While we met with some unavoidable delays in completing this project, the (nearly) finished product was worth the wait and really adds to Trinity's curb appeal. Our members already know what a beautiful church we have at Trinity. The new stairs help the exterior to be shown in an equally positive light.

We also saw the installation of the railing for the lift entrance, which now complies with local code requirements and gives members something to hold onto as they approach the lift entrance. Our lift continues to get a good amount of use and it is definitely serving its intended purposes. Paving along Elm Street has been done, and that should complete the lift project at long last. The good news here is that these final finishing touches have not delayed the use of the lift. Our thanks to our members who have helped others with using the lift. If you need assistance with using the lift, please ask an usher for help.

Virgil Switzer is also very busy at Trinity with a host of improvement projects that he's taken on in addition to his custodial duties. From restoration of our copper light fixtures to power washing the courtyard to helping our Property Directors with assorted tasks, Virgil has had a hand in more improvement projects at Trinity than any other member in recent months. Please ask Virgil to show you some of his accomplishments when you see him at Trinity. He rightfully takes a lot of pride in his work, and I think you'll be pleased to see the fruits of his labors. Our Property committee is also very active in keeping our building in great condition and we thank them for their ongoing efforts as well.

With the help of Dan Bay, cameras have been installed at our north and south entrances. These cameras are on our computer network and they allow our secretary to not only see who is at either entrance right from her computer, but they allow her to talk to the person at the door as well. Not only does this add a convenient feature to our two main entrances, it adds a nice security feature as well. Activity at either entrance is now triggered by motion and recorded with a still photo taken by the cameras. While the primary goal of these cameras was convenience / safety, the added security they instill is a great benefit as well.

Finally for now, we continue to raise money for our ongoing improvement projects. Those again include reassignment of our church offices for optimal utilization of our space, regrading of our courtyard for better drainage, replacement of our gym windows, repair and restoration of our stained glass windows and replacement of the narthex and library flooring. We encourage members to consider donating to one or more of these projects in hopes of completing them with no additional debt. Checks with "capital projects" in the subject line will be applied to

these projects. If you're able to help us with our fundraising efforts here, that would be greatly appreciated. Our thanks to those who have already contributed to these causes.

Scrip Fundraiser - This is a gift card fundraiser - they are the same gift cards you can purchase from retailers, including over 300 brand-name grocery, department stores, restaurants, gas stations, hotels, home improvement, etc. We order the gift cards at a discount, and you pay face value for the gift cards. (For example, you pay \$25 for a \$25 Speedway gift card - the youth group obtains the card at a discount and keeps the difference.) You can purchase gift cards by filling out an order form (located by the youth bulletin board) or by placing your order online at shopwithscrip.com.
