Dear Friends of Trinity,

Did you know, now that Easter Sunday has passed, that Easter isn't actually over yet? In the church, Easter is not a day but a season that lasts all the way to Pentecost Sunday. Jesus didn't rise from the dead and then disappear. He continued his ministry as God's victorious beginning of the new creation. Jesus' resurrection marked the time when the old order was passing and the new order was bursting onto the scene. Pentecost was the beginning of the worldwide spread of God's new resurrected order. It was truly good news for the world!

The old order of things was characterized by the exacerbation of sin by the Law and alienation from God. The new order is characterized by forgiveness and reconciliation with God. This is the gift of God through the resurrected Jesus and his work through his apostles, his inner circle of 12.

The Season of Easter is the time in which you and I have to get used to the idea of being dead to sin and alive to God as our birthright in Baptism. We really are free... and it frightens us to death! We are like prisoners just released from the penitentiary. We can't fathom life on the outside. We walk around dazed and confused, not knowing what to do next. We long to return to the order, structure, and 3 squares of life in the pen. Yes, it's prison but at least it's familiar! If only we can go back to the way it was before.

But we can't. It would be a step backward. New wine doesn't belong in an old wineskin. Our old ragged and torn, but comfortable, prison clothes have been stripped from us. We now have a new covering—a white robe cleansed with the righteousness of Christ. It's our new identity that is not fit for the old ways. We need to learn to get used to it.

There will be those who will beckon us back to the Law, to self-righteousness, to the prison of rules and regulations. It will sound appealing. It will be a song sung to the tune of an old favorite. But don't listen. Shut your ears to those words of death and cling to your new identity in Christ! You are alive and loved by God, free to be one who has passed from death to life, and given space to act out what is humanly good and true and excellent as you have been gifted with these.

Trinity has been richly blessed as a congregation and this year has chosen 3 mission projects, all dealing with hunger on some level to support. Currently we are gathering funds to support SowHope, a group founded by Ginny DeCarlo's niece. Jeff McDonald and Kim Blecke had the opportunity to meet with Mary Dailey Brown in March and what follows are some highlights of that conversation. Envelopes for donations may be found in the hallway by the display and we have also placed little "churches" to gather any change you would like to deposit both upstairs and downstairs.



The name SowHope came to Mary from God. She argued with Him about it. 80% of the world's farmers are women. The name brings women in the third world to tears. When you sow hope, you reap hope. God won this one. Guess He knew what He was doing.

Mary began by doing mission work at her church and wanted to expand into an area that focused on women but found that NO ONE did. She wasn't planning on forming her own organization, but after 3 weeks of searching, she and her husband used their life savings (including an inheritance from her father-in-law) to start the organization. When her father-in-law realized what his gift had done, it brought him to tears.

SowHope goes in and seeks local leaders and LISTENS. They do not come in with ideas for them; they need local input as to what the problems are and what the solutions should be. Americans, while well-intentioned, waste a lot of time and money on ideas that WE think are right. When local input is solicited, they OWN the solution. Trust goes a long way in helping people.

The birth center; which we are seeking to replicate for them in another area of need; was built with mud walls by a group of women literally with their own HANDS. They managed to procure a tin roof, but needed \$2,000.00 for furniture (beds, curtains, etc). They bought a MOTORCYCLE to use as an ambulance (yes, for women in labor). They made 35+ transports in their first year about 10 miles away over dirt paths to get women c-sections (100% survival rate). All would have died absent this transport.

They have no shortage of needs and projects. They are short on cash – not where to use it. They have just raised the millionth dollar in December of 2012. They are using funds from 2012 to fund future projects and to make sure that they stay ahead in terms of their income and expenditures.

For those of us who expect charities to adhere to accountability guidelines, SowHope has an excellent rating from GuideStar – an organization that rates charities on their return on “investment.”

It seems clear that a little (relatively speaking) goes a long way with SowHope and we're hoping to collect enough from Trinity to fund a new birth center for them. Please help if you can!
