Dear Friends of Trinity,

Think about this—when compared to the breadth of the entire universe our planet, Earth, is infinitesimal. It seems big to us because we live on it. But our planet is traveling at breakneck speed around a burning nuclear furnace we call “The Sun”. We are sailing through a very insignificant corner of our galaxy, which itself is spiraling in a very insignificant corner of our universe. But we recognize that the Bible points beyond itself to the One who is revealed in its pages. And it tells us that we are on the receiving end of God’s mercies through no merit of our own. It’s the narrative of people messing up, getting it right, messing up again, and how Jesus made it right for all time!

Beginning in September my sermons are going to be “off lectionary”, which means they will not be based on any of the assigned readings. Rather, I’m going to go through the Bible a book at a time and I would invite you to either follow along with a pew Bible or bring your own Bible to use. Scripture has so much to offer, but we have to open it first. I promise that my sermons will be short and interesting. I’ll point out things that are important to know without getting bogged down in nitty gritty details. I hope you will enjoy this as much as I will, and I will welcome any feedback along the way.

We need your help to make this benefit a success! This event is open to the community so invite your friends and neighbors to join you. If each member would talk to and invite 10 others to attend our event, we would have a full house and we would be able to help a lot more children!

**What is “Feed my Starving Children?”** This is a Christian nonprofit hunger relief organization that provides food to help communities in developing countries become self-sustaining. FMSC’s approach is simple: Volunteers hand pack scientifically designed meals, which are shipped to partners in nearly 70 countries and used to run orphanages, clinics, schools, missions and community feeding programs. \$80 feeds a child for one year. Children need food to learn. Without food they can’t concentrate and many will even drop out of school. FMSC Mobile Pack events are scheduled to enable children and adults across the United States to help pack these life-giving meals. FMSC provides guidance and logistics, and you provide funds, time and labor to pack the meals. We have over 50 church members who have volunteered to help with this mobile packing at Lincoln-Way High School on Saturday morning, August 10<sup>th</sup>. If you missed the sign up for the packing event or are going but able to do more, there are some additional volunteer opportunities below you can do. - **Logistics Volunteer** (help move boxes, wrap pallets, etc.) is needed for EACH shift on Friday and Saturday (sign up for 1 or more shifts if you can)
- **Greeters / Hairnet Distributors** (welcome volunteers and hand out hair nets) are needed Friday and Saturday for various 1-hour shifts
- **Marketplace Store Volunteer** (help sell shirts, etc.) is needed on Friday and Saturday for various shifts (ranging from 30 to 90 minutes)
- **Kitchen Volunteers** (cook and serve Manna to volunteers, set out snacks, etc.) are needed on Friday and Saturday for various 90-minute shifts
