Dear Friends of Trinity,

I want to take this opportunity to introduce a new process that will be coming to Trinity. At the same time, I want to give you the opportunity to help launch it from the ground floor.

The process is called **Living Lutheran**. It is way of introducing the Lutheran faith to newcomers, visitors, the genuinely curious, and people with a lot of questions about the role of faith in today's world. The goal of this process is to expose as many people as we can to the Christian faith with the end result of assimilation into the life of our church for those who wish to go that far.

Living Lutheran consists of 3 phases: 1) Inquiry, 2) Candidacy, 3) Baptism and/or Confirmation. Phase 1 is for those who have little to no exposure to the Christian faith or church life and have lots of questions; Phase 2 is for those who have completed Phase 1 or who are coming to us from non-Lutheran church bodies; Phase 3 is for those who have completed Phase 2.

This is a process that builds on itself and will hopefully become as natural as the air we breathe at Trinity. The official launch of this process will be in October. Until then, we are looking for people who will serve as Sponsors for people in Phase 2. That is where you come in. We want to connect people coming to our congregation with people who are already members. **Please contact me if you are interested in being a Sponsor for newcomers.**

I want to thank the members of the Living Lutheran Task Force, who met with me to help me think through putting this process together. They are: Jennifer Mudrock, Bob and Kim Blecke, Rex Toepke, and Debbie Crawford. Your input has been very helpful!!

This process will be introduced to the congregation after services on July 30 and 31. I hope the possibilities excite you as much as they do me!

Updates from Jeff McDonald, Council President: July was a busy month at Trinity, so I thought I would provide you with an update of what has been taking place this month. Our gym window project is about 70% funded and the project itself is 50% done. You will see the windows on the north side of the gym have all been replaced. Since the majority of those windows were cracked, the new windows not only look better, but will be much better at insulating the church. They are not only solid panes of glass, but they are thicker than the old ones and should make a positive impact on our heating and cooling costs. Look for the windows on the south side of the gym to be replaced during the month of August, which will officially complete this job.

We also began work on the courtyard regrading project. All existing sidewalks in the courtyard have been removed and we are now scheduled to have new underground drain pipes installed to aid in getting rain water away from the church and prevent it from collecting in our courtyard. This project remains largely unfunded, although we do have savings we can use to pay for this project if we're unable

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to raise sufficient funds for it. This was identified by our Property Committee as the top need of all of our projects, so we are happy to see the job begin and we look forward to it being completed before pre-school begins this fall.

We also received a generous donation toward the office remodel project and we hope to have that project begin soon. As a reminder, the plan is to move Pastor Hoag across the hall to the current Youth Room, Church Secretary Doris Klemm will move to Pastor's current office, Doris' current office will become the church office (for use by Sunday School and other church groups), and the Youth Room will be relocated to the basement. This project will not only improve the use of our space, but it will give us an opportunity to update each of these offices in the process.

Our front steps are complete and they really enhance the 'curb appeal' of our house of worship now that all of the stone work is done (thanks once more to Terry Puttkammer for his efforts on this project). The only item left to install is the railing, which we also hope to have done during the month of August.

As you can see, July has been busy and we have more work planned for August. We could really use any financial support for these projects that you're able to offer, as we have a fairly large gap between what we have raised so far and what we expect these projects to cost. Our physical plant has seen a lot of improvements over the last 18 months and these additional projects will further enhance Trinity. On behalf of church council, I want to specifically thank those members who have already donated toward these projects. We have a long tradition of members stepping up and generously funding the needs of the church, and we are hopeful that our current improvement projects will benefit from this same generosity. We do plan to use a portion of our savings to fund these projects if need be, but we want that to be our last resort. 
