### Update from our Church Council President, Jeff McDonald

As we approach the holidays, I wanted to elaborate on one of our current causes - Morningstar Mission and encourage you all to get involved with this cause this year. It is well known that congregations with an internal focus do not thrive nearly as well as congregations with an external focus. One of the easiest ways for a congregation to turns its focus to the external is to find a good cause and support it, and our group has done that year after year when it comes to Morningstar Mission. But to remind us all of the importance of this support, I wanted to document a few things about this mission as a reminder of why we find them so worthy of our support. Please consider the following points:

- Morningstar lost all state and federal funding when they refused to abandon their faith-based message to the people they serve. While it would be very lucrative for them to stop using the Bible as the main source of help for those they serve, they refused to compromise their integrity and chose to stay true to their message. As a faith-based organization ourselves, we have long found it important to help support this local mission, particularly since they no longer receive any governmental funding.
- The number of people who need the services Morningstar provides is regrettably on the rise, and the recent ushering in of cold weather will only push that number up even higher in the coming months. One of the reasons we support this charity at Christmas-time is because that is when their need is the greatest, but they have seen a steady rise year over year in the number of people needing help.
- With generous support from individuals and businesses in the area, Morningstar has been able to provide basic needs (clothing, a hot meal, a hot cup of coffee (which is ALWAYS served in a mug...remember we helped with hundreds of mug donations several years ago) and more) to thousands of women, children & men in our community who need their help. They also provide housing to a select few, with women & children in one area and a men's home in another. They require sobriety from all those they serve and they do what they can to help them regain their independence. Notably, they do all of this <u>without charge</u> to any of those they serve.

Now, one of the ways we choose to help this organization each year is through their Stars of Hope. Children from the mission are given the opportunity to list some wants and needs on a sheet of paper and members of the community get to play "secret Santa" by going out and getting some of those things for these kids. These are generally kids who are not likely to get presents at Christmas time, and they are very pleasantly surprised to see a community come together and generously provide them with things they both want and need. There are three ways you can help with this as follows:

1. Sign up to buy for one of the Stars of Hope. Jen DePolo and Kim Standard are in charge of our 10 stars this year and they are looking for members to adopt a star. That commonly involves a purchase of at least \$40 from the needs list and \$40 from the wants list. I can tell you first hand,

these are likely to be some of your most rewarding purchases of the year, knowing you are buying for people in need.

- 2. Sign up to shop for one of the Stars of Hope. If you'd like to go buy gifts and turn in your receipts, we will use the proceeds from our Giving Tree envelopes to cover those purchases. This ensures that the kids are getting things from their list and if you'd like reimbursement for that shopping, please feel free to turn in your receipts.
- 3. DONATE to this cause by putting a donation in one of the envelopes on the tree in our hallway. If you're writing a check, you can make it out to Trinity and just put "Morningstar Mission" in the subject line. 100% of the funds we raise, after covering any receipts we receive from our shoppers, will be donated to Morningstar Mission to help them continue to do what they do. There is no limit on what we can donate here, and if many of us came together and all gave something to this, we could really make a difference for this mission.

Thanks for reading and hopefully the above has helped to explain why we feel our support of this mission is important, and why we choose to support them year after year. Thanks in advance for helping to make this effort worthwhile.
