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### **Update from our Church Council President, Jeff McDonald**

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Our traditions continue this year at Trinity, and in December some of our annual traditions include the Cookie Walk, the congregational Christmas party and the Morningstar Giving Tree. We hope to have a lot of participation in all three events, so please consider joining us for all three of these December activities. Details of each follow below.

For more years than I can count, Trinity's Women's League has organized the annual Cookie Walk. This has been their only fundraiser and it has been a great success every year. We are thankful to all members of Women's League for the efforts that go into this. As a consumer of the cookies sold at this event, I can tell you this is a great opportunity to taste some outstanding homemade cookies baked by members of our congregation. If you haven't been before, consider stopping by on December 2nd to check it out. You can also donate your own cookies to the event on Friday, December 1st, if you'd like to help us with having a great supply of cookies to sell. We also appreciate Donna Cuthbert for her willingness to organize the cookie walk this year. Our Women's League members will still be working hard on this project, but Donna agreed to jump in this year and lead this event when Women's League asked for help in the running of the event. Proceeds from this event will go to the benefit of Trinity Lutheran Church, and that more than likely means our stained glass window fund, which continues to build thanks to the generosity of our members. We are about half way to our goal on the stained glass window repair fund, so if you are considering an end-of-the-year gift, please consider supporting this effort to help ensure that our beautiful stained glass windows can be enjoyed for generations to come.

Next up is our annual congregational Christmas party, which is hosted again this year by our Social Ministry committee on Sunday, December 3rd. We meet in the fellowship hall for pizza and an assortment of sides and desserts (like the cookie walk - this event is always pleasing to the taste buds!). Afterwards, there are kids games in the gym and caroling in the church to all of the Christmas classic hymns. It's a great time of food and fellowship that is sure to help put you in a festive mood for the Christmas season. A sign-up sheet for this is outside the gym.

Throughout the month of December, we are again supporting Morningstar Mission. If you aren't familiar with them, you can find their website at [www.morningstarmission.org](http://www.morningstarmission.org). But a high level summary is that they are a faith-based organization right in our community that helps people in need with their physical and spiritual needs. Because they insist on remaining faith based, they are not eligible for state funding. That means they are even more reliant on funds from members of the community to help them carry out their mission. We have a number of "Stars of Hope" where you can purchase gifts (both wants and needs) for a needy child at the mission and a number of envelopes on the giving tree in the hallway. Funds collected in those envelopes go to Morningstar to allow them to continue doing what they do and this is our annual drive to support them financially. This is a great way to help a faith-based organization right

in our community, so please consider helping out with this either by signing up for a Star of Hope or by making a donation in one of the giving tree envelopes.

Not to overlook the obvious, but we also have our Christmas services at Trinity this year as we do every year. We start off with the Sunday School Christmas Program on December 10<sup>th</sup> in place of the 10:30 am service. The children have a unique way of telling the story of Christ's Birth. There will be a Saturday Night Service at 5 p.m. that will be a Christmas Eve Service without communion. With Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday this year, we will have our regular Christmas Eve services at 5 p.m., 7 p.m. and 11 p.m. on December 24<sup>th</sup> but will not have services that Sunday morning. Aside from this, our schedule should be fairly normal this year but do keep an eye on our calendar for December to make sure you're up to date on all that is happening at Trinity this month.

As Thanksgiving concludes and the Season of Advent begins, there is much to be thankful for here at Trinity Lutheran Church. On behalf of church council, I want to thank all of our members for their ongoing support of the church and for all that you do to keep the church going. This is a great church family to be a part of and I look forward to observing Advent alongside the members of our congregation.

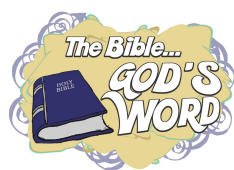
