While this was an unexpected \$18,000 expense, it will serve us very well and it prevented us from having to have it installed later as an emergency repair. So, all things considered, the timing of this was not that bad. Jeff Lorenz is currently working on the carpentry part of this project and has framed the room for now. Insulation and drywall will follow and then flooring, cabinets, appliances and a host of other things will need to be done. Our Social Ministry committee is planning a 'kitchen shower' for when the project is complete, so be on the lookout for details of this in future newsletters. But it will be a nice way for us to celebrate our newly remodeled space, which we hope will bring us years of food and fellowship. I don't have updated totals for this project yet as we are in the process of having some bids revised, but I can confidently say it is going to exceed our budget. If you were contemplating any sort of year-end giving, I am sure your gift could be put to good use with this project.

Other than the kitchen, we are at long last having the broken windows in the newly renovated youth room repaired. Most were cracked but one was shattered, which necessitated the replacement of all four windows. We are fortunate to have the funds on hand to cover this cost, and we hope the new windows will enhance the space now that our youth have done such a nice job redecorating that room. If you haven't seen it lately, take a walk downstairs and check it out. You're welcome to go explore the kitchen project as well, just use caution depending on what the condition of that room is.

I am looking forward to what the year 2020 has in store for our church and to worshipping alongside you in the coming year. But before we get too far ahead of ourselves, let's not overlook the coming month of December and all that it means to us. 
Members using church envelopes may pick up their 2020 envelope boxes on the table in the hallway. Envelope boxes not picked up in December will be mailed the 2nd week of January.
