Dear Fellow Trinitarians,

How many Bibles do you have currently in your house? The average home has five. Are those Bibles being put to use? Studies show that they're not and are mostly collecting dust on a bookshelf or stashed away in a box. Some use a family Bible as a centerpiece for their coffee table. That would be an example of a Bible having some kind of function, although merely decorative. But it's hardly the purpose of a Bible. Bibles are made to be read and heard.

The Holy Bible is the inspired Word of God and the narrative of salvation. It's not a self-help manual or a therapist's notes. It is the record of God's actions in our world chiefly as they have been accomplished by Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of our sins and eternal life. It shows that humanity cannot save itself from condemnation and destruction, for humanity has neither the will nor the ability to do so. Page after page shows the utter helplessness of people in spiritual matters as they are enslaved in sin, and how God continually comes to the rescue.

That's the beauty of Scripture. It declares that God satisfies His own righteousness and justice in the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. You cannot get that message anywhere else!

One of the liturgies we use occasionally contains what's known as the Collect for the Word. I leave it here for your consideration and offer it as a prayer for you: Blessed Lord, You have caused all Holy Scripture to be written for our learning. Grant that we may so hear them, read, mark, learn, and take them to heart that, by the patience and comfort of Your holy Word, we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. SOLE HOPE PROJECT

Many African children are infected with jiggers, small sand fleas that enter bare feet and burrow into the skin. If left untreated, jiggers become a huge problem, leading to infections, paralysis, amputation, and in some case, death. The shoe parts we cut out of old jeans and will be sent to Uganda and made into shoes for children there who are in need. Sole Hope also provides work to those who sew the shoe parts together, thereby supporting families.

When you volunteer at a workshop you help in providing jobs, shoes and HOPE to Uganda. By cutting out the shoe parts, you provide the tools that our shoemakers need to make the shoes that can help keep thousands jigger-free.

Social Ministry will be hosting two workshops on Tuesday, February 2nd from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. and again from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. If you are able to help us, please sign up on the sheet on the card table outside the gym.
