Dear Friends,


The Season of Lent has quickly arrived in this new year. It's earlier than usual this year, with Ash Wednesday falling on February 14, which is also Valentine's Day. It almost never happens that these two observances fall on the same day. I might suggest that you have your celebration of Valentine's Day on Tuesday the 13th. That way you can have your hearts and chocolates along with your paczkis. You can't lose!

I sometimes get asked if giving up something for Lent is an acceptable practice for Lutherans. I always answer that it is. Fasting and other outward expressions of repentance is always a good thing. But something to keep in mind is that you shouldn't make a spectacle of it. It is also important to remember that, while Lenten practices are admissible, they are not required. You don't have to fast. You don't have to give up something. Lent does not negate our firm belief in Christian Liberty (1 Corinthians 10:31). In short, if you want to, go ahead. If you don't want to, then don't. It's neither commanded nor forbidden.

Galatians 5:1 says, "It is for freedom that Christ set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." This is why we observe Lent. Through the cross of Christ we have the freedom from things that try to keep us in bondage. Jesus' blood and merit has rescued us and has assured us a place in God's everlasting kingdom!

A blessed Lent to you all. May the Lord Jesus' patient endurance give us the strength to withstand all the wiles and temptations of the devil. God's many blessings to you!

I have been fortunate to have served these last two years with these spiritually moved and motivated individuals. New to the Council this year is Kim Gappa who volunteered to serve as a Director of Outreach. Welcome Kim; we look forward to working with you. Thank you, Bob Jackman, for your valued contributions to Outreach over the years. I would also like to extend a special "Thank You!" to all our returning Council Members, and I encourage you to do the same.

The Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, February 4, 2024. A potluck luncheon will be served downstairs following the 10:30 service. The meeting will be held in the gym after the luncheon. Please join us as we review results from 2023 and discuss plans for 2024.

What Is Lent All About, and Why Is It Important?

The purpose of the Lenten season is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ and his life, death, burial, and resurrection. Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the night before Easter Sunday. Lent prepares us for Good Friday and Easter.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u> is the first day of Lent. We reflect on our mortality and on the fact that we are but ashes and dust, and to the dust we will return. We lament our sins which have alienated us from God. We receive our Lord Jesus' body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins.

<u>Maundy Thursday</u> is the establishment of Jesus' last will and testament he gives to his disciples for the life of the world as he institutes the Sacrament of the Altar.

<u>Good Friday</u> is the solemn celebration of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, where we see the result of our sinfulness. Jesus died for us and as us, giving his life unto death to save the world from its sinful ways and reconcile it to God once and for all.

<u>Easter Sunday</u> is the joyful celebration of Jesus' rising from death and thereby sealing eternal life for us and for the world. While we still experience death, it is still conquered by Christ. On the Last Day we will be raised from our tombs clothed with immortality and incorruption.

The traditional practices of Lent are Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving (giving to the poor). These are not done to earn anything from God, but instead are kept as the outpouring of the love of Christ first given to us. Attending Lenten worship on Sundays and during the week are wonderful ways of keeping Lent.

It is our prayer that your keeping of Lent will help you be mindful of the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.


