I pray that the Holy Spirit will equip you to navigate the many obstacles that are thrown in your way that could cause you to stumble in your faith. I also pray that you continue to receive the gifts of Jesus Christ in Divine Service at Trinity each week! Have a very Happy and Blessed New Year!
