An update from Church Council President, Jeff McDonald.

2018 was another good year for Trinity. We appear to be on target to come in just under what we budgeted for the year, and we also completed upwards of 20 projects throughout the year (some of them were planned, others were not). The cost of these projects was nearly \$33,000 and we have been able to fund all of them as of this writing, with only modest contribution from our savings for this. We also provided financial support to a number of outside organizations in addition to what we took care of within our own four walls. Tim King has put together a nice exhibit of these expenditures and it will be available for your review at the 2019 Annual Congregational Meeting. Whether or not you've attended this meeting in the past, it is open to all members and it will occur after the late service on Sunday, January 27th, in the gym. Please join us if you'd like to hear more details about the workings of the church.

We will also be bidding adieu to Jan Prospero, who is resigning her post as Financial Secretary in 2019. Janice has been Trinity's self-taught Financial Secretary since 1999 and she has given an enormous amount of time and energy to Trinity over the course of the last twenty years. My tax statement from Trinity is always the first one that I receive each year and while I keep pretty meticulous records of my own, I have come to rely on Janice's records for not only being very timely, but extremely accurate as well. I hope you will join me in thanking Janice for her two decades of support - as a congregation, we owe her a debt of gratitude. We welcome Tamara Doerrer in 2019 as our new Financial Secretary, and we very much look forward to having Tamara on council with us.

Our big project for 2018 was to restore our stained glass windows. As you may recall, we discovered earlier this year that with some minor maintenance, we should be able to get another 10-20 years out of them so we went ahead with that maintenance instead. We are just waiting on some parts before that is done, and we expect Suevel Studios to complete their work in the first week or two of January. We are still doing exploratory work on a kitchen remodel project, and we recently had a plumber do some investigative work for us to help us determine the feasibility of remodeling our kitchen in the downstairs fellowship hall. As you might guess, we will also be working closely with the Village on this to confirm that they are also on board with what we propose doing, and that we won't have to incur any additional costs as a result of this project other than those we expect. If we get all green lights on this, which regrettably remains an "if" at this point, we would look to begin this work soon after our Easter breakfast in April. Please look for more updates on this project early in 2019, as I am hopeful that we'll find a way to push forward with this much-needed remodeling effort.

As we look ahead to 2019, we have much to be thankful for at Trinity. We look forward to another successful year with our members and to continuing to make Trinity a church we can all be proud to call Home.
