While this took longer and cost more than we initially had hoped, the finished product is a great addition to the church that is not only structurally sound, but visually appealing as well. Our thanks to our property team, Scott Beaudry with Sterling Concrete and Terry Puttkammer on a job well done.

We also contracted with Dan Bay to install new windows in the gymnasium for us. Dan is having Virgil Switzer assist him with parts of this project and we hope to see this completed by the end of the month. One window was already replaced as a test and it is a marked improvement over the double-pane broken windows that are in there now. We also anticipate a much more efficient space once the new insulated glass is in.

We are also still moving forward with the regrading of the courtyard, which should help us to prevent water damage from the heavy rains we experience every spring. The
