Update from Church Council President, Jeff McDonald.

As mentioned in June, the office remodel project is nearly complete. We had a minor change in the project this month that caused a bit of a delay, but we are nearly at the point of moving Pastor Hoag across the hall to a larger office where he will have more space to meet with parishioners in his office. We will then move Judi Donovan into his current office and have the current secretary's office available for general church use. We anticipate this will be better overall utilization of our space and I'm happy to report that the end is in sight for this project. In the meantime, you may notice that we got railings for our center stairs installed in June. These were put in where the old chair lift used to be.

I have had a number of people ask me about our stained glass window project in recent weeks, so I thought I would go over that project again. Please feel free to stop me at church if you have questions about this. Basically, what we need to do is remove each individual stained glass window, take each pane from the frame, flatten the frame (over time, gravity pulls down and they sag), reinstall the glass and then reinstall the windows. This is strictly a maintenance item, but as you may know, most of our windows either don't open or don't close - both due to this same issue. If left unattended, the sagging would eventually cause the windows to break. I'm not even going to guess at what new stained glass windows for the church would cost, but I will say that would probably run into seven figures.

The analogy I have used for this is that it's like getting new tires on your car. You really won't notice a big difference to look at it, but it's not something you can afford to ignore or you'll end up with a bigger bill later.


As you can probably imagine, there are not a lot of companies who do this. When we got a quote for this approximately 10 years ago, the cost was over \$40,000. We are guessing that may be closer to \$45,000 now, but we don't want to get an updated estimate until we are closer to the point of tackling this project. To date, we have raised just over \$18,000 for this and once we get closer to \$40,000, we will begin the process of getting updated bids and moving forward with this project. We appreciate the support we have had so far for this project and I will continue to provide updates on this until it's done. We have a beautiful church at Trinity, and this is part of the care our church needs.



\$10 provides 4 Arch Books (early childhood Bible stories)


\$25 provides 10 teen devotionals




St. Matthew's
