Our thanks to Tom and Tommy Buell for their work in removing a number of cabinets from the fellowship hall kitchen and doing some exploratory plumbing work. As mentioned last month, we will be converting the old bathroom at the west end of fellowship hall to a closet, as the bathroom was not used and this eliminates the need for us to run a hot water line to that end of fellowship hall. In the end, this should help to simplify the plumbing configuration in that room.
