Dear Friends,

On the day I'm writing this we are right in the middle of VBS. Today's lesson was the Parable of the Good Samaritan. And although folks tend to reduce this parable down to moral platitudes (i.e. we should help other people) I was struck by the parallels to Jesus this parable brings to light.

The parable is about a man who went above and beyond. He purposefully placed himself in mortal danger to help a man who would've been his enemy otherwise.

It sounds like something Jesus did, doesn't it?

The Samaritan had to cross a valley to get to the wounded man (Samaritans and Jews didn't travel on the same roads), placing himself and his animal, most likely a donkey, in a very precarious climbing expedition. Likewise, our Lord Jesus descended from the glories of heaven to be with people who were dead in trespasses and sins. Enemy territory. And he gave up his life and commended his spirit to his Heavenly Father.

The Samaritan took the wounded man to an inn in Jewish territory. He could have gotten killed by angry townspeople for entering their town with a wounded Jewish man. The townspeople could have easily accused the Samaritan of attempted murder. But the Samaritan took the man to an inn and paid for his care. He "paid the price". Jesus paid the price that was necessary for our salvation—not with silver or gold, but with his own body and blood as he innocently suffered and died on the cross.

Jesus is our Good Samaritan. As we were left for dead as lost and condemned creatures, Jesus comes to rescue us, to care for us, to feed us, and to take us to safety. The cross is the path; the joyous end is the crown of life.

I hope everyone is enjoying summer!

Points that were addressed during our May 19<sup>th</sup> Church Council Meeting included:

- There is now a QR Code posted on our website to make online giving easier.
- We discussed the echo-like sound, the reverb effect, that people have noticed with Pastor's microphone. Reverb Effect, short for reverberation, is an audio effect that simulates the way sound reflects in a space. It creates a sense of space and depth by adding reflections to the original sound, making it sound as if it's in a larger environment. Reverb can be achieved naturally through physical spaces or artificially through audio processing.)
- The Midweek Lenten Report was presented.
- We are considering altering the times for our fall services.
- There will be an adjustment to Preschool. Preschool days will now be Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.
- Family Sundays will continue, throughout the summer, and take place every third Sunday of the month and include a children's sermon.
- Vacation Bible School: Set up will be June 14 and 15. VBS will take place from June 16<sup>th</sup> – June 20<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 11:30am. This year's theme is Epic Australia.
- New cushions for the Choir Loft have been purchased.

## LCC Disaster Response Ministry

LCC Disaster Response deploys, coordinates and manages volunteer teams as they respond to disasters throughout the United States and beyond. LCC trains volunteer Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) through our LCMS congregations in many areas of disaster response.

Approximately 850 active LCC volunteers have been certified in basic LERT training. Many have gone on to certify in additional training such as chainsaw, heavy equipment, debris removal, flood recovery with pumps, mucking homes and how to provide emotion and spiritual care. LERT volunteers can prepare, cook and serve meals to volunteers and affected communities while deployed. For LERT volunteers, disaster response is an essential relief and outreach ministry.

In the chaos of disaster, it's important to stay focused on the task at hand. LCMS Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) training will help you focus on the most important thing to remember as you prepare for or to respond to a disaster in your community or beyond. At the center of our LERT volunteer training is one thing: **MERCY!** Christ's mercy is the basis for everything we say and do. This training event will equip you to be an effective volunteer should a disaster strike your community. After a brief introduction regarding the goals and theological rationale of LCMS Disaster Response, the LERT volunteer training will address the following:

- Christian Care In Times of Disaster
- A Ministry of Presence
- The LERT Program and How It Works with Other Responders
- Introduction to Disaster Response
- LCC/NID Disaster Response & Deployment Protocol
- Service Opportunities after a Disaster & Safety Protocol

LERT training is also now offered to youth, ages 14 – 17, so they can also assist in general disaster response safely and under the guidance of their own youth leadership. LCMS Disaster Response has developed new guidelines for youth participation. A parent must be present and sign form for participation.

If you know someone who would be a good addition to your LERT Team, encourage them to register and attend.

or

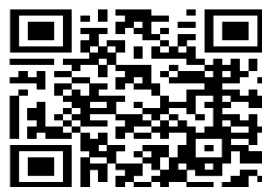

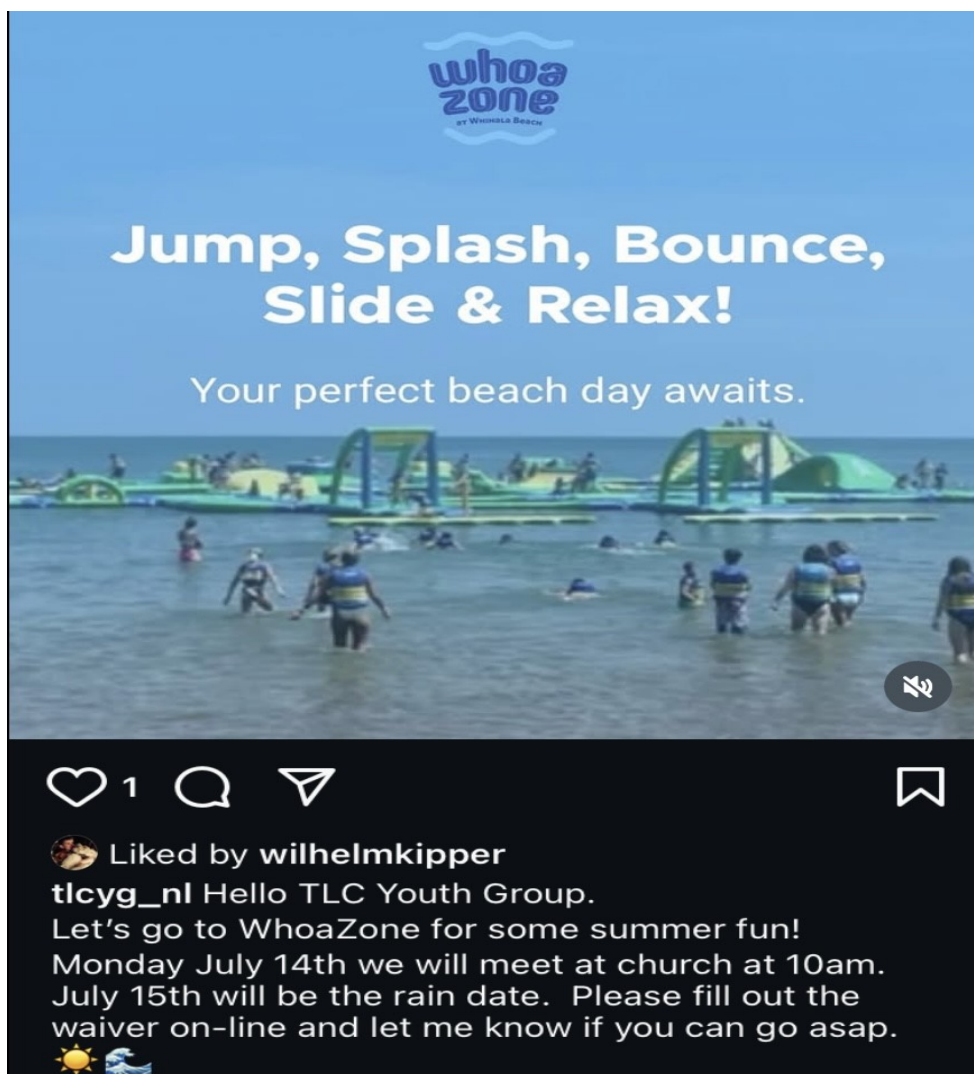
This Year Our Focus will be: "Fishers of Men"
