June marks the start of our summer break from council meetings, but there is plenty ongoing to keep us busy. The final stage of the office moves is nearing completion. Our Property Committee is working on some electrical and paint work in Pastor's old office and then we will be installing the new cabinets for what will become the Church Secretary's office. At that point, the current Secretary's office will be for general use by all of our groups. It's been a long haul, but the finished product will be worth the effort and we will have much better utilization of our space as a result of these moves.

Next is the stained glass window project. We have all of our bids in and Rex Toepke volunteered to help analyze the bids for us. Rex will be working closely with our Property

Committee to explore these bids in a bit more detail and a recommendation of which contractor to choose will follow. Council will call a special meeting to review the recommendation and ask any final questions and then we plan to move ahead with this project.
