Financial Report: The congregation adopted a 2016 General Fund Budget of \$207,457 at its Annual Meeting on January 31st. The Budget is 2.8% higher than the 2015 budget. The Council deemed the adjustment warranted to cover expected operating costs. Modest salary increases of 2% were granted for Pastor, the Church Secretary and Choir Director. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

Our congregation was truly blessed with financial support during 2015. General Fund receipts, that were higher than in 2014, and special donations allowed the payment of all commitments. We want to thank everyone for their support of Trinity Lutheran Church and its missions. UPDATE FROM OUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT, JEFF McDONALD. As we discussed in this year's annual meeting, our 75th anniversary year in 2015 was a great year on a number of levels, one of which involved the church itself. Two major improvements to our house of worship included a new organ and the long-awaited installation of a lift, both of which are used with regularity to the enjoyment and benefit of our members. We will be finalizing the last of the lift project (railings, Elm Street paving and Cedar Road stairs) as soon as the weather warms up enough for this work to be completed.

We went on to discuss some other improvements that our church could use and we hope to raise sufficient funds to accomplish these improvements either in 2016 or 2017 (the stained glass window repair cost will be sizable). Our top priorities this year include regrading of the church courtyard to address water run-off, replacement of the gym windows with more efficient (and unbroken) windows, movement of several of our current rooms and offices for better utilization by all, new flooring in our library and narthex and repair and maintenance of our beautiful stained-glass windows to ensure they are enjoyed for decades to come. Please be on the lookout for signs in the church about these various projects - including how you might help us fund one or more of them - as we are hoping to raise money from our members to fund these improvements without incurring any debt for our church. Please also be on the lookout for ways in which you can help with certain of these projects, as some of them will benefit from volunteers willing and able to donate their hands and their time. Our thanks to the Property Committee as well as a number of others who have volunteered to assist in the completion of these projects.

We also discussed the possibility of employing Virgil Switzer as our Custodian and the possibility of supporting Virgil in his move to the area. I am pleased to report that Virgil

has already taken up residence in Joliet in an apartment near the train station and he is looking forward to commencing part-time employment by Trinity starting on March 1st. Virgil is currently enjoying a 10-minute train ride from his new home to Trinity compared to the 3-hour ride he used to endure to attend our services. Please join me in welcoming Virgil as our newest employee!


