UPDATE FROM OUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT, JEFF McDonald There is not a lot to report this month, but I will add a few highlights from the February council meeting. We made the second payment to Suevel Studios for their stained glass work and we are waiting for one or two minor repairs yet from them to complete their work. If you see tape on the stained glass window nearest the altar, this is the reason for that. We should have this work done in March and then we should be in a great spot for the next 15-20 years before a more major repair/maintenance job is needed on our stained glass.

Moving on to the kitchen, which we hope to be our next major project, we have draft plans drawn up for the kitchen that we intend to use for our permit application as well as for any contractors that we may hire to do parts of this job for us. We are planning to host one further meeting on Sunday, March 3rd, in the kitchen downstairs after the second service where we will review those plans to make sure there is consensus on the plans. If you'd like to see those plans, please plan to stop by around 11:30 on the 3rd of March. We plan to apply for the permit in March and we are hopeful that we won't be required to add any unforeseen steps to what we would like to do in this space.

We will plan to have another landscape clean-up day before Easter Sunday (hopefully when the weather is a bit warmer!), so please be on the lookout for that. It will be a Saturday morning and the more people we get, the faster it will go. Things are generally looking great around Trinity, and this is an opportunity to help make the outside of our church look as good as the inside.


