Dear Friends of Trinity,

Here's some thoughts on free will. It's a popular topic.

What did you do today? Do you have any plans for tomorrow? Did you drive your car to the store or to a house to visit a friend? Did you make a sandwich for yourself? Who picked out what you are wearing today?

These are what we call "earthly (or human) matters". In these things, we are completely free to choose whatever we want to do. These have not been divinely appointed or determined by God ahead of time. In these matters, we have free will.

We do not have free will in spiritual matters (things related to God). We cannot by our own natural reason or strength believe in the Lord Jesus Christ or come to him. This can only be done by the operation of the Holy Spirit upon us. We can only do those things which require everyday reason and common sense to function in the everyday world.

The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. – 1 Corinthians 2:14

The Holy Spirit *calls* us through the Gospel, *enlightens* us with His gifts, *sanctifies and keeps* us in the true faith in Jesus Christ. We are believers *only* because of the work of the Holy Spirit. We did not make this decision out of a supposed "free will". We do not become spiritual people by a volitional act.

Faith is a gift and thank God that it is! Otherwise, we would be left wondering if our faith is good enough or strong enough. Wonder no more! Through this gift of faith in Jesus Christ we are saved by the grace of God!

#### Update from Council President, Jeff McDonald

Our main building-related focus continues to be the kitchen at this point. We are securing bids for the various portions of this job that will need to be farmed out and the numbers are initially a bit higher than we initially had anticipated. This is not a complete surprise, I suppose. It seems as though jobs like this always involved bigger-than-expected costs. We are in the process now of updating our estimate for this job and will consider modifications to our original plans if need be. I don't see anything yet that would cause us not to move forward with the project (I think we can all agree that it really NEEDS to be done!), but I want to make sure we have a good handle on the projected cost of this project as well as how we are going to fund it. We have had very generous support for this project so far, and I thank all who have already donated to this cause. If you were considering supporting this project, early estimates are that we could use some additional support to fund the project as a whole. I hope to have firmer figures soon.

In anticipation of moving forward with this project, we do have the approval from the Village to start demo so that we can better determine what needs to be done with certain aspects of the job that are not readily seen at present (i.e. plumbing, electrical, etc.). We expect to have everything moved out of the kitchen shortly so that we can better determine what needs to be done when we officially kick off this project. We still need to gain approval from the Fire Department, but we expect to be able to comply with their requests and gain their approval in time. I hope to be able to provide more specifics about this project next month. Jan Clark from Social Ministry floated the idea of having a shower for the new kitchen where members could buy new things for the newly remodeled space and I think that is a great idea. Look for details on this in the coming months.

If you don't already have this on your calendar, please plan to come to Trinity at 6 p.m. on Sunday, May 19th to hear a presentation from Joan Aubele, author of the best-selling book <u>The Dance - A Story of</u> <u>Love, Faith, and Survival</u>. Joan is a cancer survivor who has overcome immense odds and we're honored to host her at Trinity to talk about her story. I am sure every one of us knows someone who has been impacted by cancer. Hearing how Joan overcame the challenges she faced and how her faith played a role in that promises to be inspirational. Our thanks to Jan Toepke and our Social Ministry for arranging this presentation for us. The presentation is being funded by Social Ministry and is free to attend. Please plan to join us.

Last but not least, we are also hosting the Trinity Tailgate event again this year - this time on Sunday, June 9th. This event will be open to all to attend and will include opportunities for those wishing to compete in a BBQ contest as well as an opportunity to simply sign up and come and eat. Following dinner, our Social Ministry committee will host an ice cream social and then we will have Pastor & Dan's band, Revival, play from 7-9 p.m. for all in attendance. This is a great opportunity for our members to join in this festive event and also a great opportunity to invite your friends to come and see Trinity.
