Financial Secretary' and Treasurer' 3rd Quarter Report:

Financial Secretary's & Treasurer's 3rd Quarter Report: The congregation adopted a 2011 General Fund Budget of \$198,127 at its Annual Meeting on January 30. The Budget is 2.5% higher than contributions made to the General Fund in 2010. The Council deemed the increase warranted to cover higher operating costs, i.e., benefits, building maintenance, insurance and other necessities. A modest salary increase of 2% was granted to Pastor – after no increase last year. Primary support of the General Fund by the congregation is very important to meeting Trinity's ongoing needs.

During the quarter, all due bills were paid. Contributions budgeted for Missions and LCCF, through September, were remitted to Synod. General Fund receipts were slightly below those in 2010, however, normal operating expenses have been running below budget. The balance on the original \$100,000 mortgage, used to finance the new restrooms, was \$35,590.37 at September 30. We want to thank everyone for their support of Trinity Lutheran Church and its missions. If you have any questions, please contact Jan Prospero, Financial Secretary, or Bruce Hasch, Treasurer.
