Friday **10/26** is the set-up for Craft/vendor fair.


Saturday **10/27** is the Craft/vendor fair from 9-3 and Expressions worship at 6pm. Church Council Elections.

Told you it was a busy month! And that's just OUR stuff...


**Youth News:** If you are going to the High School gathering next year,
