As you have probably noticed, the office move that I promised would be done in July (or was that June?) remains in the final stage of being nearly completed. Long story story, but the office door had to be re-done and that process encountered a number of delays that were beyond our control. The good news is that we are back on track and I will just conclude by

saying this will be done shortly. Hats off to Jeff Lorenz for his patience in dealing with all of this, and hopefully you will soon see this project completed.


A couple of other property-related items you may notice include our parking lot and our copier. We will be a resurfacing and re-striping our main parking lot, which we hope to have done this Fall. Another winter in its current state would only allow the current cracks in the asphalt to widen and would ultimately be costlier to repair, so we are aiming to have this redone yet this year. We are also reviewing bids for a new copier, as the current copier has become obsolete. A newer machine will not only be cheaper to maintain and operate, but should operate more efficiently as well as giving us scanning capabilities, which we do not currently have. Council will be discussing this when we resume our meetings this month, but the projected cost of the parking lot resurfacing is \$2,900 while the projected cost of a new copier looks to be in the range of \$5,000 to \$6,000. We will discuss how to fund these projects, but both are seen as improvements that would greatly benefit the church.

Speaking of projects that cost money, I wanted to give you a quick update on our stained glass repair fund. We have raised close to \$19,000 to date for this project and will continue to look for donations and other ways to generate funds for this project, which we anticipate will cost upwards of \$45,000 to complete. If you typically make end-of-the-year donations to charities, we ask that you prayerfully consider including this project in your giving this year. We have made great strides in funding this project, but you can see we have a long way to go yet. We appreciate the generous support we have already received and we look forward to eventually having these windows preserved for generations to come by properly taking care of them.

It was great to see a packed church in the summer months with just one Sunday service. Hopefully you have considered my idea from last month's newsletter of reaching out to a neighbor and inviting them to Trinity. Perhaps we can pack the church in Fall/Winter months as well!
