## From Council President, Jeff McDonald

For a quick update on the kitchen remodeling project, I can tell you that the electrical work required by Knight Security to extend our alarms is done. There is more electrical work to be done in the kitchen, but we had to run additional wiring through fellowship hall for our alarm system and that is either done now or will be done very shortly. The kitchen floor had to be saw-cut in the last week of August so that we could run new waste lines since the existing lines were not usable, and that required severing some of the radiant heat lines in the floor. We will be working to repair those lines once the new waste lines are in place and that will be a major step in the right direction for this project. Several members also got involved in reviewing appliance options for the space and we have a number of options to consider for that as a result of those efforts.

The English District recently sent out grant applications to member churches seeking applications for what to do with their proceeds from the sale of Bethany Lutheran Church. They committed to offering grants totaling \$300,000 to area churches, so we have applied for as much as \$15,000 in the form of a grant for our kitchen project. Grant applications are due by September 3rd and from that point, a committee will determine who is eligible and what to award to whom. We are not in dire need, as we have other resources we could tap into to pay for this project, but since the costs seem to be consistently running higher than expectations for this project, we felt it was appropriate to apply for this grant and see if we could fund a portion of the project with grant money. I hope to know by the time of the October newsletter whether we will be receiving any funds from this project or not.

Finally, I will close by returning to a theme I have expressed before. Traditional churches as a whole are struggling with declining membership yet evidence supports the idea that a great many people first interact with a church simply as a result of being asked by someone they know to attend. If you enjoy your worship and membership experience at Trinity, why not share that with a friend or neighbor? Invite them to join you and be a part of our congregation. Or just help promote Trinity on social media by checking in or posting about your membership experience at Trinity. The worst they can do is say 'no,' but you might be helping them to become a part of our church family at Trinity, which is something our current members cherish. We are called the spread the gospel...it might be easier than we think to do just that.
